- Voice 1: When **he** was a lad of twenty-three

- V: 1 & 2: He conquered life's hurdles, and now you see

- V: 2 He was first in his troop to be Eagle Scout—
Now the BSA says (V. 3 spoken) "Sorry, you're out!"
- V. 1 The Army beckoned. (V. 4 spoken) "Don't ask, don't tell."
- V. 2 That wasn't his dish—and that's just as well. (*All repeat line*)
- Quartet: He conquered life's hurdles, and now you see
V. 1,2,3,4 He's a VIP in the community.
- All: He conquered life's hurdles so perfectly

- V: 5 When you judge a person on the basis of sex
You use a very narrow and a warped index.
- V: 6 Lesbians and gays are in every field
