INTRO: Across the United States and Canada, Indigenous women and girls go missing at an unrelenting rate. The murder rate for American Indian and Native Alaskan women is more than 10 times higher than any other ethnic group. When a Native woman disappears, her case typically draws far less media attention than if she were a white woman – generally none at all.

In Wisconsin, May 5th has been designated Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women Awareness Day.
